DAY 1 | WELCOME TO BELGRADE Belgrade

Upon arrival in Belgrade, Serbia's vibrant capital, your driver will welcome you and escort you to your hotel. Enjoy the sights of New Belgrade, featuring Socialist architecture and modern business centres, during the ride from Nikola Tesla Airport. After hotel check-in, use your free time to rest and prepare for the journey ahead. In the evening, we recommend a leisurely stroll through one of Belgrade's oldest quarters to **Skadarlija**, the city's bohemian heart. This charming 19th century cobbled street is lined with "kafanas" where you can enjoy delicious local specialties and traditional music.

DAY 2 | VIBRANT CAPITAL OF SERBIA Belgrade

On your first day in Serbia, you will embark on a walking and driving tour around Belgrade, starting at **Knez Mihailova Street**, the city's bustling pedestrian zone, filled with shops, cafes, and historic buildings.

EXPERIENCE MORE / Serbian Morning Routine: Your guide will take you to a hidden gem close to the main district, **the city's oldest tavern** intriguingly known as "?" (Question Mark), where you'll try Serbia's most cherished traditional drinks: coffee and rakija, but also learn about the UNESCO-protected art of making "šljivovica", Serbia's renowned plum brandy.

Having started the day like a true local, we will walk through the historical Belgrade Fortress and Kalemegdan Park and be amazed by the view of the mighty Sava and Danube rivers.

Crossing Branko's Bridge into New Belgrade. our panorama tour begins. You'll experience the bold Brutalism architecture and see the emerging Belgrade Waterfront, a symbol of the city's modern transformation. Continuing the journey, you'll gain insight into Serbia's past, from its 19th century struggle for independence





to its turbulent 1990s. We'll stop for a visit and devote time to the impressive **Temple of Saint** Sava, the symbol of the city and the fourthlargest Orthodox temple in the world, adorned with stunning mosaics.

Our tour concludes in the lively heart of Serbia's bustling capital - The Republic Square, having offered you an insight into both the city's and the country's diverse culture, heritage, and history.

DAY 3 | TREASURES OF VOJVODINA Belgrade - Fruška Gora NP - Sremski Karlovci - Novi Sad - Belgrade

Today, you will explore the most interesting sights of **Vojvodina**, a province in northern Serbia. Visit Fruška Gora NP, the "Serbian Holy Land", with its 17 active monasteries, including the well-preserved Krušedol Monastery, where you can buy wine and rakija made by the monks. The tour continues to Sremski Karlovci, a cultural gem with its Baroque centre, Patriarchal Court, Orthodox Cathedral of Saint Nicholas, and historic secondary school.

Step into the enchanting Fruška Gora wine region, home to Serbia's finest wines. Enjoy a delightful array of wines at a local winery, showcasing the region's diversity and craftsmanship. Don't miss trying **Bermet**, an internationally acclaimed Serbian wine that famously graced the tables of the Titanic.

Your next stop will be **Novi Sad**, the vibrant capital of Vojvodina and 2021 European Capital of Culture. This **multicultural gem** is renowned for hosting **EXIT**, Southeast Europe's largest music festival. Wander through its lively pedestrian zone, where historic landmarks like the City Hall and the old city centre blend with cultural sites. Explore the impressive Petrovaradin Fortress, often called "Danube's Gibraltar", where you can enjoy stunning views of the Danube River and the cityscape, perfect

for capturing unforgettable moments.

After a short drive, you will return back to Belgrade and enjoy the rest of your evening. Overnight: Belgrade

DAY 4 | BANAT TO TRANSYLVANIA Belgrade - Timișoara - Sibiu

Your day ends with a tour of Sibiu, once the largest and wealthiest of the seven fortified towns, and home to Romania's first hospital and pharmacy. Today, **medieval walls** still encircle the old town, where narrow streets weave past historical landmarks, including the Large Square with the Brukenthal Museum - Romania's oldest museum, the Small Square, the Council Tower, the Orthodox Cathedral of the Holy Trinity. inspired by Hagia Sophia, and more.

Check-in to your hotel and rest before the tour continues

Overnight: Sibiu

DAY 5 | TRANSYLVANIA UNVEILED Sibiu - "Astra" National Museum Complex - Transfăgărășan Road - Sinaia

After check-out, enjoy your leisurely morning with a cup of coffee on the charming cobbled streets of Sibiu, after which we'll continue our journey through the heart of Transylvania to our next destination.

A true Romanian journey must include exploring its traditional villages, and the "Astra" National Museum Complex offers a perfect glimpse into this heritage. As one of Europe's largest open-air museums, it showcases the essence of rural life.

EXPERIENCE MORE / Transfăgărășan Scenic Road: The legendary 90km route of Transfăgă**rășan** is often described as "the road to the sky". Take a ride on the cable car towards the stunning **Bâlea Lake**, a glacial gem nestled amidst the peaks, where its serene waters mirror the beauty of the Făgăraș Mountains.

Continue towards Sinaia, nestled in the Carpathian Mountains of Romania, and renowned for its stunning natural beauty and historic charm. Check-in to hotel and soak in the memories of the day.

DAY 6 | THE CASTLES OF TRANSYLVANIA Sinaia - Peles Castle - Brasov - Bran Castle - Sinaia

Our day begins with a visit to Peles Castle, where King Carol I of Romania was once mesmerized by the breathtaking Carpathian Mountain scenery. Captivated by the views, the royal family chose this location for their summer residence, resulting in a magnificent Neo-Renaissance masterpiece. This combination of noble taste and ingenious engineering makes Peles Castle a true marvel.

The tour continues to **Braşov**, founded by the Teutonic Knights in the 13th century. Baroque buildings, churches and relaxed cafés line the main square, Piata Sfatului, after which you'll walk towards the Gothic-style cathedral, Biserica Neagră, famously called the Black Church.

But the day isn't over yet, as mystery awaits in Bran Castle, commonly known as Dracula's Castle. This 13th century gothic fortress, set atop a 60-meter cliff, offers an irresistible journey back to the Middle Ages. Discover how the legend of Vlad the Impaler became the inspiration behind Bram Stoker's "Dracula".

In the evening, return to your Sinaia hotel as you collect your impressions and memories from Transylvania.

Visit the monumental People's Salvation Cathedral, set to be the largest Orthodox church in the world, then explore the colossal Palace of the Parliament, the second largest administrative building in existence.

Next, stroll through the **Old Town**, discovering the elegant Romanian Athenaeum, a 19thcentury concert hall famed for its circular. fresco lined auditorium and superb acoustics. Continue to the historic Royal Palace, now home to the National Museum of Art of Romania. and the peaceful **Stavropoleos Monastery**. known for its intricate stone and wood carvings. The cobblestone streets, lively cafés, and restored façades of this district capture the city's enduring charm.

Next, you'll head to the nearby village of Arbanasi, known for its well-preserved traditional architecture and serene atmosphere.

Finally, explore Plovdiv, one of Europe's oldest cities, where heritage is marked by a striking blend of ancient Roman, Ottoman, and Bulgarian influences. Located on the banks of the Maritsa River, the city presents a rich cultural mix and a unique architectural blend, earning it the title of an open-air museum. DAY 12 | SOUTHERN ROADS

After check-out, we leave Bulgaria and head to Niš, a vibrant city in southern Serbia and the birthplace of Roman Emperor Constantine the

Great. Explore the historic Niš Fortress and the cobbled Tinkers Alley, the last part of Niš's old market, now full of cafés and restaurants. For an authentic taste of southern Serbian cuisine. savour local specialties like ćevapi and sarma. Next, we travel to the Resava Valley to visit the

medieval Manasija Monastery.

Renowned for its well-preserved floor mosaics, wall frescoes, and architectural marvels, Manasija Monastery also houses an exceptional collection of religious art and manuscripts, offering a deep insight into the spiritual and artistic legacy of medieval Serbia.

Finally, we'll drive to Serbia's capital city, Belgrade, for hotel check-in and a free evening. Overnight: Belgrade

DAY 13 | "SERBIAN TUSCANY" DELIGHTS Belgrade - Šumadija Region - Zlatibor Mountain

The tour concludes in Višegrad, with a visit to Andrićgrad, or Stone-Town, built by Kusturica on the emerald Drina River, featuring cultural facilities and the UNESCO-protected bridge. After lunch, continue to **Sarajevo**, the capital of Bosnia and Herzegovina, for hotel check-in.

DAY 15 | BALKAN SOUL CAPITAL

We'll also visit iconic sites like the Vjećnica (City Hall), wrapping **the entire tale** of this soulful city. End

this unforgettable experience with a taste of heavenly **baklava** and savour the true essence of Sarajevo's history and cuisine.
