ONF-WAY SPLIT TO DUBROVNIK

DAY 1 (SATURDAY) | Split Set Sail - Brač Island

At 4 pm, meet your skipper for a welcome and safety briefing before setting sail to the Island of Brač. Known for its stunning coastlines and rich heritage, Brač is home to Vidova Gora, the highest peak on Croatian islands. Famous for its exquisite white stone, Brač has provided materials for iconic structures like Diocletian's Palace and even the UN building. Explore Brač's "Olive Island" reputation by walking **the Olive** Trail, and visit the Cukrov Family Olive Oil Museum. The stunning Zlatni Rat beach, known for its unique shape, beckons sunbathers and water sports enthusiasts alike. Meanwhile, **Supetar**, the island's vibrant hub, offers delightful restaurants and essential supplies for adventurers.

DAY 2 (SUNDAY) | Brač Island - Hvar Island - Pakleni Islands

Hvar, the sunniest island in Croatia, offers a perfect mix of beaches, nightlife, and history. Start at the iconic Hvar Fort, with stunning views of the town and Adriatic Sea, then explore Stari Grad, a UNESCO World Heritage Site rich in ancient Greek history. Relax at **Dubovica** Beach or visit the nearby Pakleni Islands, ideal for swimming in clear waters. As evening falls, enjoy fresh seafood at a seaside restaurant before heading to Carpe Diem, Hvar's top nightlife spot.

DAY 3 (MONDAY) | Hvar Island -Šćedro Island - Pelješac Peninsula

Stay on Hvar and explore the renowned vineyards in the Hvar region, such as those in

Sveta Nedelja or Ivan Dolac. These vineyards offer a taste of some of the finest local wines and an opportunity to learn about the region's rich winemaking traditions. If you prefer a peaceful retreat, you can also head towards the tranquil island of Šćedro.

Later in the day, set sail towards Lovište on the Pelješac Peninsula. With 5-6 hours of sailing ahead, you'll have ample time to take in the serene beauty of the sea and surrounding sights.

DAY 4 (TUESDAY) | Pelješac Peninsula - Korčula Island - Mljet Island

Set sail from Lovište to the historic city of **Korčula**, the fifth island in our itinerary. Known as one of the most serene islands of our adventure, Korčula was named by the Greeks for its dense pine forest - Korkyra Melaina, meaning "Black Corfu". Korčula Town, often known as "Little Dubrovnik", boasts impressive city walls, medieval squares, churches, and palaces - which still hold secrets about the life of the renowned explorer Marco Polo. When in Korčula, we recommend stopping by a local wine bar to taste premium varieties such as Grk, Plavac Mali, and Pošip, or visit some of the family wineries for an even more authentic experience! Continue the journey to the serene Island of Mljet.

DAY 5 (WEDNESDAY) | Mljet Island

Explore the unspoiled oasis of Mljet National Park, renowned for its saltwater lakes and lush landscapes that, according to legend, captivated Odysseus for seven years. The park covers most of the island, including Great Lake and Small Lake, Saint Mary's Benedictine monastery, and Polače, the best natural anchorage in the Adriatic. Besides a Dalmatian lunch and swimming, the island offers amazing snorkelling opportunities. The seabed is a must-see for divers, especially in the lakes,


other sea creatures. For an active day, enjoy canoeing, cycling, or hiking, while the island's serene atmosphere makes it perfect for a romantic getaway.

DAY 3 (MONDAY) | Hvar Island - Vis **Island**

Vis Island is one of Croatia's most remote and unspoiled Adriatic islands, making it a perfect getaway for travellers looking for tranquillity, authentic experiences, and untouched landscapes. Stončica Bay, located on the northeastern coast of Vis, is one of the island's most beautiful and serene spots. DAY 4 (TUESDAY) | Vis Island

Komiža is a charming fishing village located on the sunny western coast of Vis Island, Croatia, well sheltered from cold, northerly winds. Nestled in the largest bay on the island, it features narrow alleys and slender houses that enhance its authentic Mediterranean atmosphere. The village is known for its beautiful pebble beaches, with Kamenice Beach being the most famous, and renowned for its ice-cold spring waters. Shaded by tamarix trees, this area transforms into a lively gathering spot every evening, blending natural beauty, rich history,
